

The year 2001 marks the Council's 40% answersary. We celebrated this occasion at an animal gala dinner on May 14 at the Monarch Hotel in Washington. The Stair Foundation, chaired by Council board member Maurice Gerenberg, was the principal sponsor of the evening.

The highlight of the evening was the presentation to board member Dr. Henry A. Kissinger of the Council's award for Datinguashed International Leadership. Dr. Kissinger, who was introduced by former Council chairman Lieutenant General Brent Scowcroft, spoke about the importance of the transattantic relationship and the challenges it faces. Dr. Kissinger raised the question whether Europe could express its identity only in opposition to the United States. The Financial Tions reported on the speech in its May 16 issue as follows: "Describing tensions in the transatlantic alliance as the 'source of my greatest concern,' [Kissinger] said the alliance stood at the moment of its greatest opportunity, and it would be ironic if it statted to full least." to fall apart.

Chairman Henry E. Catto made commemorative remarks highlighting the Council's four decades of promoting constructive bipartisan U.S. leadership and engagement in international affairs based on the central role of the Atlantic community in the contemporary world.

Over 400 goests attended the celebration, including many of the Council's cosporate spousors and individual members. The guests also included senior officials from the U.S. Administration, Congressional and malaxy leaders, and many members of the Washington diplomatic community.
