Cette rencontre, organisée en partenariat avec la Ditchley Foundation (Royaume-Uni), par *Sir Nigel Broomfield*, Ditchley, et *Dominique Moisi*, Ifri, avait pour objectif d'évaluer l'état des relations transatlantiques dans leur dimension économique et politico-stratégique. Elle a bénéficié de la présence de deux anciens Premiers ministres, co-présidents de la conférence, *Edouard Balladur* et *John Major*, et de celle du ministre des Affaires étrangères, *Hubert Védrine*. Elle a rassemblé des délégations française – conduite par *Thierry de Montbrial* –, britannique, canadienne et américaine.

Les participants sont allés au cœur des causes des tensions transatlantiques – alimentées selon les uns par les signaux confus adressés par l'Europe, par le syndrome américain de superpuissance selon les autres. Il a été convenu qu'en raison de la complexité des deux "systèmes", européen et américain, une approche sophistiquée était requise, notamment pour lutter en brèche des perceptions mutuelles souvent émotionnelles. Dans le domaine économique, les participants ont reconnu que, si la culture des *share-holders* n'était pas bien établie en Europe à certaines exceptions près (capitalisme rhénan), les convergences entre les systèmes économiques avaient
